

# Fire Safety Officer



This course is an accredited program for people who occupy the Fire Safety Officer position in Health Care, Correctional facilities and commercial premises. The course is specifically aimed at those appointed as Fire Safety Officers (FSO). This course will train participants in the requirements of Australian Standards AS 4083-2010 Planning for Emergencies – Health Care Facilities, AS 3745-2010 Planning for Emergencies in Facilities and meets the requirements of the NSW Health Policy Directive (PD2010\_024) – Fire Safety in Health Care Facilities. The training provides participants with the appropriate knowledge and skills to perform the duties and responsibilities of the Fire Safety Officer with confidence. It provides the competency required to undertake emergency planning, implement, and coordinate emergency response procedures, and be familiar with the operation of installed systems and building fire safety. Participants will be trained in their obligations under the Work Health and Safety Act 2011 and Regulations 2017. This course is the prerequisite for those wanting to complete the Fire Safety Managers course. Students will be awarded a Statement of Attainment upon the successful completion of units:

**PUAFER001 Identify, prevent, and report potential facility emergency situations, PUAFER002 Ensure facility emergency prevention procedures, systems and processes are implemented, PUAFER004 Respond to facility emergencies, PUAFER005 Operate as part of an emergency control organisation, PURFER006 Lead an emergency control organisation PURFER008 Confine small emergencies in a facility**

- Demonstrate knowledge and practical application of first attack firefighting equipment
